John S. Bush,
I now dep'ne to the Presidents, that Joseph Jacobs,
a single man, and the sole heir at law of Stephen Jacobs,
deceased of this name, &c., for and in consideration of the sum
of Two Thousand Two hundred Dollars, to me in hand paid
by John S. Bush, of Broken Bow, O. T., receipt whereof is here
by acknowledgement, have granted, bargained and sold and by these
presente freely given, granted, released and conveyed unto the said
John S. Bush, the following described lands situate in the
 Creek Nation of the Indian Territory, United States of America,
and more particularly described as follows, to wit:

All that portion of the north half quarter of Section Two (2)
Twp. 96th N. R. 14th E. North, Range Fourteen (14) East, lying south
of the boundary line between the Creek and Cherokee Nations, and the
Southwest quarter of the north east quarter of Section One (1),
Twp. 96th N. R. 14th E. North Range Fourteen (14) East of the Indian
Breed and Merriam, law said Creek Nation of the Indian Territory, con-
taining one hundred and sixty acres, more or less, according to the
United States survey thereof; being the original allotment of
Stephen Jacobs, deceased,

To have and to hold the aforesaid premises unto the said
John S. Bush, and unto his heirs and assigns in fee simple forever;
and I, the said Joseph Jacobs, hereby acknowledge with the said
John S. Bush that the original allotment Stephen Jacobs is dead,
that it is the will of Stephen Jacobs deceased, and the only
heir at law of said Stephen Jacobs, deceased, and the only
person, having any right, title or interest whatever in and to the
aforesaid hereinbefore mentioned and described, that I am law-
fully seized in fee of said premises and have a good and
wellfounded title to the same, that the same are free from
all heirs and encumbrances of every character and description
that I have good right to sell and convey the same, and that I will
and may bear all charges, expenses, warrant and defend the title to
said premises against the lawful claims and demands of all
persons whatsoever.
