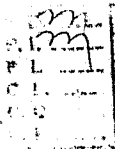

Know All Men By these Presents,
That I, J. W. Waring, an unmarried man of Tulsa, Indian Territory,
for and in consideration of the sum of Twelve Hundred Dollars, cash
in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have
granted, bargained, sold and conveyed and by these presents do here-
by grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said C. S. Walker,
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lots or parcels
of land lying in the City of Tulsa, and within the Western District
of the Indian Territory, to-wit: The south Fifty feet or the south-
erly half of Lot One (1) in Block One Hundred and Eighty-Eight
(188), in the City of Tulsa, Indian Territory, according to the Government
plat thereof.

To Have and to hold the above described premises, together with all and
singular, the rights and appurtenances thereto in anywise belonging,
unto the said C. S. Walker, his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby
bind myself, my heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and
forever defend, all and singular the said premises unto the said C. S.
Walker, his heirs and assigns, against every person whomever law-
fully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
