 the Act of Congress approved April 21, 1904, (33 Stat., 204), I
 have made a full investigation in connection with the application
 of John L. Denbo a citizen by blood of the Cherokee Nation, for
 the removal of the restrictions upon the alienation of his allot-
 ment (except his homestead), and am, as the result of that in-
 vestigation, satisfied that the removal of restrictions upon the
 alienation of his allotted lands, except as to his homestead will
 be for the best interest of the allottee, and I so recommend. The
 approval of this certificate does not in any manner determine the
 right of the allottee to any particular tract of land.
