Timber contract.

Moses Jefferson
to

George W. Adams

This indenture witnesseth:

That Whereas Moses Jefferson a Creek citizen a citizen of the Creek Nation, Indian Territory has selected as his allotment, the following described lands, situated in the Creek Nation, Indian Territory, to-wit:

$\frac{1}{4}$ of NE⁴ + $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE⁴ sec 23 + E 20 acres off of see -
Twp - N Range --, the $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE⁴ sec 23 also the
 $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW⁴ of sec. 24 - Twp 19 - N - Range - 11 E.

all in Twp. 19 - N - R - 11 E. common 160 acres Twp - N Range -
Now therefore, we Moses Jefferson and his wife parties
of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum
of one dollar to us in hand paid by George W. Adams
party of the second part. the receipt of which is hereby
acknowledged do hereby sell and convey to the said
Geo. W. Adams and unto his successors and
assigns forever, all the timber lying, being, standing
or growing upon the aforesaid land except for
5 year the full amount being paid.

And in further consideration hereof, the second
party agrees to pay to the first parties, as follows.
— dollars per thousand feet of timber by long measurement
dollars per thousand feet for timber suitable for ties, and
— dollars per thousand for fence posts or fence rails, and
— dollars per thousand spikes for fencing and
— dollars per thousand cords of wood, to be cut and made
out of the timber on said land as aforesaid by
second parties or his assigns.

The said party of the second part hereby covenants
and binds himself successors and assigns to pay
to the party of the first part in person or to their
executors or administrators (but not to their assigns
or transferees, except upon the written consent
of the second party or assigns, or ninety days
notice by first party to second party in writing)
for all such timber so cut and used as aforesaid
in installments of — dollars (or less, according
to the amount due as timber is being removed)
