General Warranty Deed

to

Grant R. McCullough

This instrument, made and entered into this 4th day of September 1857, by and between Kate Benson, party of the first part, and William Benson, her husband, of Okemah, Indian Territory, and Grant R. McCullough, of Tulsa, Indian Territory, party of the second part.

Witnesseth, That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred and no/100 dollars, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said party of the second part, the following described real estate and premises situate in the Cherokee Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit: An undivided one-tenth interest in and to lots four (4), five (5),
nine (9) and the southeast quarter of the southwest quarter of
and the South Twenty acres of lot six (6), of Section
Ten (10), and the North east quarter of the Northwest quarter,
and the Northwest quarter of the Northeast quarter of
Section Fifteen (15) in Township Nineteen (19) North; of
Range Twelve (12) East of the Indian Base and Meridian,
except right of way of Arkansas Valley & Western Ry. Co.
herefore deeded together with all the improvements
thereon and the appurtenances and immunities
thereunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining, and
convey and defend the title to the same.

To have and to hold the said land unto the said
party of the second part, his heirs, executors, administrators
and assigns, forever.
