

when the same becomes due and payable; or if any taxes or assessments now or hereafter levied or imposed against said real estate are permitted to become delinquent; or if default be made in the agreement to keep said property insured, as herein set forth, then in either of these cases the sums hereby secured with the interest thereon shall immediately become due and payable at the option of the mortgagee or assignee without notice. Then the said grantee, or his assigns, agent or attorney shall have power to sell said property at public sale to the highest bidder for cash at the front door of the U.S. Postoffice in Tulsa Indian Territory, as the same may be located at the time of sale, public notice of the time and place of said sale having first been given thirty days by advertising in some newspaper published in said Tulsa I.T., or by printed or written hand bills posted up in five public places in said Tulsa I.T., at which sale the said grantee or assignee may bid and purchase as any third person might do, and we hereby authorize the said grantee or assignee or legal representative to convey said property to any one purchasing at said sale, and the recitals of his deed of conveyance shall be taken as prima facia true, and the proceeds of said sale shall be applied, first to the payment of all costs and expenses attending said sale including reasonable attorney's fee; second to the payment of debt and interest and the remainder if any shall be apportioned to said grantors or their assigns.
