And I hereby authorize the said grantee or its assignee to convey said property to anyone purchasing at said sale and the recitals of his deed of conveyance shall be taken as prima facia true. and the proceeds of said sale shall be applied first to all costs and expenses attending said sale, second to the payment of said debt and interest and the remainder if any shall be paid to said grantor.
