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This Indenture made this 4th day of November 1907 between J. C. Cloud, Tulsa, Ok., party of the first part and, Clefton C. Drew, Tulsa, Ok., party of the second part.

Witnesseth:— That for and in consideration of the sum of Four Hundred and Sixty (\$460⁰⁰) Dollars the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the party of the first part has bargained sold granted conveyed and by these presents hereby bargains, sells and conveys to the party of the second part, his executors administrators and assigns the following described property the title to which is hereby guaranteed to wit:

One Iron gray horse, weight about 1200 pounds left eye out, branded "C" on jaw ten years old, one white horse weight about twelve hundred pounds branded "E" on jaw nine years old, one threerd one fourth new, double Wyoma wagon, one set of double harness half worn.

One red cow seven years old branded "W.H." or "H.H." on left hip weight about one thousand pounds, One red cow four years old branded "H" on left hip, weight about nine hundred pounds.

One red cow three years old branded "S" on left thigh weight about eight hundred pounds muley.

To Have and to Hold the same unto the party of the second part his executors, administrators and assigns forever conditioned however as follows.

Whereas, the said party of the first part is indebted to the party of the second part in the sum of Four Hundred and Sixty (\$460⁰⁰) Dollars as evidenced by his two certain promissory notes of even date herewith respectively for \$60⁰⁰ and \$400⁰⁰ due respectively January 1st 1908, and November 1st 1908, with interest at the rate of eight per cent per annum from date with attorney's fees. Now if the said party of the first part shall well and truly pay to the party of the second part the sum hereinbefore mentioned and all
