General Warranty Deed.

This Indenture, Made and entered into this 17th day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seven by and between Chas Whitenack and Lydia Whitenack of Broken Arrow, parties of the first part, and W.H. Ruth

of Broken Arrow 2^d part 4 of the second part.

Witnesseth, That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty - four Hundred Dollars in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto said part 4 of the second part, the following described real estate and premises situate in the Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The undivided one half of Lot number five in Block number forty six in the town of Broken Arrow Indian Territory

together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining, and warrant the title to the same.

And I, Lydia Whitenack wife of the said Chas Whitenack for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said part 4 of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.

To have and to hold the said lands unto the said part 4 of the second part, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever.
