Witnesseth, That the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred (\$100) dollars in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto said part y of the second part, the following described real estate and premises situate in the Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit: All of the east half of Lot five (5) Block forty eight (48) in the town of Red Fork Indian Territory

together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining, and warrant the title to the same.

And I, May M. McIntosh wife of the said R. J. McIntosh for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said part y of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.

To have and to hold the said lands unto the said part y of the second part, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever.
