

General Warranty Deed.

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This Indenture, Made and entered into this 15th day of November, one thousand nine hundred and seven by and between H. O. Dickenson and his wife Stella M. Dickenson of Tulsa, I. T. parties of the first part, and H. O. Hall of Tulsa, I. T. party of the second part.

Witnesseth, That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of (7500.00) Thirty five hundred Dollars in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto said party of the second part, the following described real estate and premises situate in the C. Cherokee Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit: one undivided one half interest in and to The West one half of the Southwest quarter of the Southwest quarter and the Southeast quarter of the Southwest quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section Thirty two (32), Township twenty (20) North, Range thirteen (13) East, containing thirty (30) acres more or less as the same may be

together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining, and warrant the title to the same.

And I, Stella M. Dickenson wife of the said H. O. Dickenson for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said party of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.

To have and to hold the said lands unto the said party of the second part, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever.
