WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

WESTERN JUDICIAL DISTRICT, INDIAN TERRITORY. OFFICIAL FORM

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we John H. Long and Flora Long
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One Thousand
DOLLARS,

to them paid cash in hand, the receipt of which
is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said John M. Fisher
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Cherokee Nation, Northern
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of Lots Three (3) Four (4) Five (5) and six (6) in Block
Three (2). And Lots Two (2) Three (3) Four (4) Five (5) Six (6)
Seven (7) Eight (8) Nine (9) in Block Four (4) in the
Town of Hildebrand Indian Territory according to
the plat thereof as approved by the Department of the
Interior Washington D. C.

To have and to hold the same unto the said John M. Fisher and unto his
heirs and assigns forever, with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said John M. Fisher that we
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Flora Long wife of the said John H. Long
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said John
M. Fisher all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
