do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Frank E. Moore
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Town of Tulsa
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: all of Lot seven (7) and that part of Lot six (6)
having a frontage of twenty (20) feet on Denver Avenue and a
depth of One Hundred and forty (40) feet to the alley
and adjoining Lot seven (7) with a uniform width
of twenty (20) feet, and that part of Lot eight (8) having
a frontage of thirty (30) feet on Denver Avenue and a
depth of One Hundred and forty (40) feet to the alley
and adjoining Lot seven (7) with a uniform width of thirty (30) feet
To have and to hold the same unto the said Frank E. Moore and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Frank E. Moore that she
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Lucretia C Pruitt and wife of the said Frank E. Moore
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
Frank E. Moore all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
