

WARRANTY DEED 5908 161  
WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.  
WESTERN JUDICIAL DISTRICT, INDIAN TERRITORY. OFFICIAL FORM

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we *John R. Stansbury* and *Myrtle B. Stansbury*  
*John M. Day* and *Katherine M. Day*  
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of *Two Hundred*  
DOLLARS,

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said *Wilbur W. Neal*  
and unto *his* heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the  
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:  
*Lot 4 Block 4. Stansbury Addition to Tulsa C.T.*

To have and to hold the same unto the said *Wilbur W. Neal* and unto *his*  
heirs and assigns forever, with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenants with said *Wilbur W. Neal* that *they*  
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, *Myrtle B. Stansbury* wife of the said *John R. Stansbury*  
*Katherine M. Day* wife of the said *John M. Day*  
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said *Wilbur*  
*W. Neal* all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
