KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we Will Moore and Lie Moore  
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of one  
DOLLARS, and other good and valuable considerations the  
receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said George W. Adams  
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Leek Nation  
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The North 1/2 of the south west 1/4 of section 14 + the south  
East 1/4 of North West 1/4 of section 27 all in Township 15  
North Range 12 East also North East 1/4 of North East 1/4 of sec.  
23 Township 19 North Range 11 East containing 16 acres  
more or less.

To have and to hold the same unto the said George W. Adams and unto his  
heirs and assigns forever, with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said George W. Adams that el  
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Lie Moore wife of the said Will Moore  
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said George  
W. Adams all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
