WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That Wattie Grayson ^{single and unmarried}
for and in consideration of the sum of Four Hundred + Fifty + no
DOLLARS,

to me in hand paid by E. A. Naughey the
receipt of which is hereby acknowledged
do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said E. A. Naughey
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All my undivided interest in and to the North East
Quarter of the South East Quarter of Section Four (4) and
the North half of the NE 4 of Section Fifteen (15) all
in Township Nineteen (19) North Range Thirteen (13) East
consisting of 120 Acres more or less. The same being a
portion of the allotment of Sunday Grayson Deceased

To have and to hold the same unto the said E. A. Naughey and unto his
heirs and assigns forever, with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said E. A. Naughey that he
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I Wattie Grayson wife of the said E. A. Naughey
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said E. A. Naughey
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
