

WARRANTY DEED 6195  
WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.  
WESTERN JUDICIAL DISTRICT, INDIAN TERRITORY. OFFICIAL FORM

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we Harriett Morris widow of Lybester Morris  
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty five hundred + forty  
DOLLARS, in hand paid by Anna L. French, the receipt of which  
is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Anna L. French  
and unto her heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Neesh Nation  
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: The South one half (S 1/4) of Lot One (1) in Block  
Gen (12), described as follows: Beginning at the S.E. corner of said lot  
thence in North westerly direction on front line of lot 50 feet, thence parallel  
with southerly line of said lot in a southeasterly direction 140 feet  
to rear line of said lot; thence in a southeasterly direction on rear  
line of said lot 50 feet; thence in a northeasterly direction 140 feet to  
place of beginning; also all of Lot Two (2) in Block Gen (12), both in Town of  
Suba, Sec 12 according to Government survey thereof  
To have and to hold the same unto the said Anna L. French and unto her

heirs and assigns forever, with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Anna L. French that she  
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I Harriett Morris wife of the said Lybester Morris  
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Anna L. French  
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
