KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we Lee Dora Dymond and R. B. Dymond
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred fifty (\$250.00)
DOLLARS,

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said George W. Adams
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

all my undivided interest in and to the S 1/2 of the S 1/4 and the N one
fourth (1/4) of the SE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 Sec 10 acres occupied by the Arkansas Valley &
Western Rail Road & Lots 5-6-7- and the west 10 acres of Lot 8 all in Sec. 14
Sp 19.7 R. 11 E. containing 160 4 1/2 ac and being all the allotment of Littleton
Bryhill deceased.

To have and to hold the same unto the said George W. Adams and unto his
heirs and assigns forever, with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said George W. Adams that they
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Lee Dora Dymond wife of the said R. B. Dymond
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said

George W. Adams all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
