Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The southerly forty (40) feet of Lot seven (7) in  
Block One Hundred eighty one (181) in the City of  
Tulsa Creek Nation I.T., more fully described  
as follows: Beginning at the south easterly  
corner of said Lot seven (7) running easterly parallel  
with the southerly line of said Lot at distance of 140 feet  
to an alley; thence southerly along said alley at distance of  
forty (40) feet to the westerly line of said Lot seven (7)  
thence westerly parallel with the southerly line of said Lot seven (7)  
at distance of 140 feet to Main Street; thence southerly at distance of forty (40) feet to  
the southerly line of said Lot seven (7) and unto the place of beginning

To have and to hold the same unto the said John O. Mitchell  
heirs and assigns forever, with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said John O. Mitchell that we  
\*paying and all other taxes since 1906 will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever except taxes for &

for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said John O. Mitchell  
Mitchell all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
