is hereby acknowledged.

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said John M. De Puy,
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the and being situated in the Cherokee Nation, Northern
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: The East-half of the South-east quarter and
the South-half of the North-east quarter of the North-east quarter
and the South-half of the North-east quarter of the South-east quarter, and the East-half of the South-west quarter of the South-
west quarter, all in section sixteen (16), Township Twenty (20) North and Range
Fourteen (14) East of the Verdigris Base and Meridian, containing 140 acres
more or less according to the official survey thereof, being the allotment
of Jessie Nann deceased and made and executed in pursuance of a
certain contract thereto, dated July 11, 1907.

To have and to hold the same unto the said John M. De Puy and unto his
heirs and assigns forever, with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said John M. De Puy that said land may be free from all encumbrances,

will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.
