KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That El Emathla, a married man
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00)
DOLLARS, to me paid by William M. Fewel, cash in
hand, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said William M. Fewel
and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the all neels Nation
Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

all of the South half of the N.E. 1/4 + the N.W. 1/4 of the
S.E. 1/4 all of Section 22; + all of the South 1/2 of the S.E. 1/4
+ the N.W. 1/4 of the S.E. 1/4 all of section 21 both
pieces in Twp 19 N. + Range 13 E, being the allotments
of my wife + daughter deceased

To have and to hold the same unto the said William M. Fewel and unto his
heirs and assigns forever, with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenants with said William M. Fewel that el
will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, El Emathla wife of the said William M. Fewel
for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said William M. Fewel
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
