WARRANTY DEED WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER,

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

That we Low R. Stansbury and Myrtle C. Stansbury
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of \$375.00 Three Hundred seventy five DOLLARS,
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,

do hereby grant,
bargain, sell and convey unto said Floyd Carllett and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following
lands lying in the Crick Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:
all of lot 6 in Block 6 in the Stansbury addition to the
city of Tulsa, I.T. according to the recorded plat of
said addition

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the said Floyd Carllett and unto his heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Floyd Carllett that they will forever warrant and de-
fend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And Myrtle C. Stansbury wife of the said Low R. Stansbury for and in consideration of the said sum of
money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Floyd Carllett all right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.
