WARRANTY DEED WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

That we J. D. Hagler and Margaret Hagler
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Seven hundred and fifty (\$750.00) DOLLARS,
to them in hand paid by Ella A. Welsh the receipt whereof is
hereby confessed and acknowledged, do hereby grant,
bargain, sell and convey unto said Ella A. Welsh and unto her heirs and assigns forever, the following
lands lying in the Town of Tulsa Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:
Lot numbered One (1) in Block numbered Three (3) in the
Bliss Addition to Tulsa, according to the recorded plat thereof.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the said Ella A. Welsh and unto her heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Ella A. Welsh that we will forever warrant and de-
fend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Margaret Hagler, wife of the said J. D. Hagler for and in consideration of the said sum of
money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Ella A. Welsh my all right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.
