 WARRANTY DEED
 WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

 That we Eliza Johnson and J. G. Pantler
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar and other valuable consideration DOLLARS,

 do hereby grant,
 bargain, sell and convey unto said J. G. Pantler and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following
 lands lying in the Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: All of the
Southwest Quarter (1/4) of the Northwest Quarter (1/4) in Section
Twenty-two (22) of Township Twenty-one (21) North and Range
Fourteen (14) East of the Indian Base and Meridian
in Indian Territory and containing Forty Acres more or less
according to U. S. Govt. Survey and being a portion of the allotment
exclusive of homestead of her deceased son Andrew Johnson
 TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the said J. G. Pantler and unto his heirs
 and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

 And hereby covenant with said J. G. Pantler that she will forever warrant and de-
 fend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

 And I, Eliza Johnson, wife of the said J. G. Pantler for and in consideration of the said sum of
 money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said J. G. Pantler all right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.
