# WARRANTY DEED WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

That we J. C. Williamson and Addie E. Williamson his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred and Twenty-five DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto said Frank Barnes and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The north half of the north half of the south-east quarter of the south east quarter and the north half of the south half of the north half of the south east quarter of the south east quarter of section twenty nine (29) township nineteen (19) north Range twelve east of the Indian Base and Meridian in Indian Territory containing 12 1/2 acres of land more or less as the same may be according to the United States Survey of the same made by E. C. Siler

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the said Frank Barnes and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Frank Barnes that They will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, 0, wife of the said J. C. Williamson for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Frank Barnes all right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.
