# WARRANTY DEED WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS,

That we Alexander Mc Gilvray and Ella Mc Gilvray  
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred Fifty + <sup>no</sup> 100 DOLLARS,

do hereby grant,  
bargain, sell and convey unto said The Tulsa Addition Company (a corporation) and unto its successors and assigns forever, the following  
lands lying in the Creek Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot Seven (7) in Block Three (3) in the Owen Addition  
to the city of Tulsa, Ind. Terr.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the said The Tulsa Addition Company and unto its successors  
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said The Tulsa Addition Company that we will forever warrant and de-  
fend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Ella Mc Gilvray, wife of the said Alex Mc Gilvray for and in consideration of the said sum of  
money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said The Tulsa Addition Company <sup>my</sup> rights of dower and homestead in and to <sup>the</sup> said lands.
