WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

That we L. C. Weibling and L. C. Weibling
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Eighteen Hundred DOLLARS,
cash hand paid by Julia A. Wetzel receipt of which
is hereby acknowledged and confessed do hereby grant,
bargain, sell and convey unto said Julia A. Wetzel and unto her heirs and assigns forever, the following

lands lying in the City of Tulsa Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:
Lot Seven (7) in Block Six (6) in Lindseys Addition
to the City of Tulsa Indian Territory according to
the recorded Plat thereof

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the said Julia A. Wetzel and unto her heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Julia A. Wetzel that we will forever warrant and de-
fend the title of said lands against all claims whatever. except a mortgage of nine hundred
and forty dollars and 00/100

And I, L. C. Weibling, wife of the said L. C. Weibling for and in consideration of the said sum of
money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Julia A. Wetzel all right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.
