**WARRANTY DEED  
WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.**

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

That we Henry P. Gollis and Carolina Gollis  
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred + 200 DOLLARS,  
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged  
do hereby grant,  
bargain, sell and convey unto said Charles L. Nethland and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following  
lands lying in the City of Tulsa Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Eighty (50) Feet of the West Side of Lot numbered One (1)  
in Block numbered Fifty (50) in the Original  
Township of Tulsa, Indian Territory.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the said Charles L. Nethland and unto his heirs  
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Charles L. Nethland that they will forever warrant and de-  
fend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Carolina Gollis, wife of the said Henry P. Gollis for and in consideration of the said sum of  
money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Charles L. Nethland all right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.
