OFFICIAL FORMWARRANTY DEED  
WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

That we W. E. Day and Gloranee Day  
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Twelve Hundred DOLLARS,  
to them paid by O. M. Grunwell the receipt of which  
is hereby acknowledged do hereby grant,  
bargain, sell and convey unto said O. M. Grunwell and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following  
lands lying in the Creek Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The north west quarter (NW 1/4) of the south east quarter  
(SE 1/4) of section four (4) township nineteen (19) north of  
range thirteen (13) east of the Indian meridian con-  
taining forty (40) acres according to the U.S. survey.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the said O. M. Grunwell and unto his heirs  
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said O. M. Grunwell that they will forever warrant and de-  
fend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Gloranee Day, wife of the said W. E. Day for and in consideration of the said sum of  
money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said O. M. Grunwell all right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.
