OFFICIAL FORMWARRANTY DEED
WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

That we Effie Drummond and George L. Drummond
 husband and wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Three thousand two hundred DOLLARS,

do hereby grant,
 bargain, sell and convey unto said William A. Thompson and Laura E. Thompson and unto their heirs and assigns forever, the following
 lands lying in the City of Tulsa, Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The West fifty feet of Lot Eight (8) in Block three (3) in Lindsey's
addition to the City of Tulsa, Indian Territory.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the said William A. Thompson and Laura E. Thompson and unto their heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging, as an estate by the entirety.

And hereby covenant with said William A. Thompson and Laura E. Thompson that they will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever. Subject however to two mortgages due for \$1500.00 each
one for \$1500.00 each dated both dates October 15, 1906 to the Interstate Mortgage Trust Company.

And I, George L. Drummond, husband of the said Effie Drummond for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said William A. Thompson and Laura E. Thompson all right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.
