WARRANTY DEED
WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.
That we S. K. Williams and Bessie L. Williams
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty Five DOLLARS,
to be paid by George Buchele,

do hereby grant,
bargain, sell and convey unto said George Buchele and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following

lands lying in the Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:
northern half and the west half (shown on the U.S. survey as
lots 142) of the NW 1/4 sec. 31 T. 19 N. and range 14 E. Creek
Indian Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:
lot 16 in sixteen, Block 17 no. seventeen in Valley, T. T.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the said George Buchele and unto his heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said George Buchele that we will forever warrant and de-
fend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Bessie L. Williams, wife of the said S. K. Williams for and in consideration of the said sum of
money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said George Buchele all right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.
