WARRANTY DEED  
WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

That we John O. Mitchell and Alice M. Mitchell  
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Seven hundred thirteen DOLLARS,  
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant,  
bargain, sell and convey unto said S. M. Rothhammer and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following  
lands lying in the town of West Tulsa Creek Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

all of lots numbered fifteen (15) sixteen (16) seventeen (17) eighteen (18) nineteen (19)  
twenty (20) twenty one (21) twenty two (22) twenty three (23) twenty four (24) twenty five (25)  
and twenty six (26) all in block twenty seven (27) situated in the town of  
West Tulsa Creek Nation, Indian Territory.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the said S. M. Rothhammer and unto his heirs  
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said S. M. Rothhammer that he will forever warrant and de-  
fend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Alice M. Mitchell, wife of the said John O. Mitchell for and in consideration of the said sum of  
money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said S. M. Rothhammer all right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.
