

WESTERN JUDICIAL DISTRICT, INDIAN TERRITORY.
OFFICIAL FORMWARRANTY DEED
WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

That we Creannney William and Joseph H. William
 husband and wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred eighty five DOLLARS,
 cash in hand paid by J. G. Puckett, receipt of the same
 being hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant,
 bargain, sell and convey unto said J. G. Puckett and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following
 lands lying in the Cherokee Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot one (1) in Block sixteen (16) of the Cherokee Heights Addition
to the City of Tulsa, Indian Territory, said Addition being
located on South one-half of the South-east Quarter of
Section thirty one (31) Township twenty (20) North, Range thirteen
(13) East.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the said J. G. Puckett and unto his heirs
 and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said J. G. Puckett that they will forever warrant and de-
 fend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Creannney William, wife of the said Joseph H. William, for and in consideration of the said sum of
 money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said J. G. Puckett all right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.
