

QUIT CLAIM DEED 5079

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

THIS INDENTURE, Made this third day of June A.D., 1907 between Clinton L. Goodale and Ida Mae Goodale his wife of Collinsville Indian Territory, Western District, party of the first part, and M. R. Farmers of Collinsville I.T. party of the second part,

witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One no, 00 dollars, in hand paid by the said party of the second part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has remised, released, sold, conveyed and quit claimed, and by these presents does remise, release, sell, convey and quit claim unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title, interest, claim and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following described lot, piece or parcel of land or improvements, situated in the town of Collinsville Indian Territory, Western District, and known and described as follows, to-wit:

all of Lot number ten in Block number fifty eight (58) in the town of Collinsville Indian Territory, according to the United States Government plat and survey of said town.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the appurtenances and privileges thereunto belonging or appertaining, and all the estate, right, title, interest and claim whatever of the said part of the first part either in law or equity to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, forever.

And I, Ida Mae Goodalewife of the said Clinton L. Goodale

for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
