

QUIT CLAIM DEED WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

THIS INDENTURE, Made this 13th day of August A.D., 1907 between Dickason Goodman and Lumber Co. (a corporation) his wife of J. Jackson County Indian Territory, Missouri District, party of the first part, and Elba M. North of 1224 1/2 T. party of the second part, witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar & other good valuable consideration in hand paid by the said party of the second part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has remised, released, sold, conveyed and quit claimed, and by these presents does re-nise, release, sell, convey and quit claim unto the said party of the second part, her heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title, interest, claim and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following described lot, piece or parcel of land or improvements, situated in the Western Indian Territory, 28th Recording District, and known and described as follows, to-wit:

The North Seventy-five feet (75 ft.) of Lot One (1) in Block One hundred & Twenty-five (175) in the town (now city) of Tulsa Indian Territory according to the U.S. Survey & plat thereof. This Quit Claim Deed is executed for the purpose of correcting any errors appearing in the Deed of this said Corporation to M. M. Kissong recorded in Book 6, Page 478 Records 8th Recording District at Sapulpa. It is more especially to obtain a proper acknowledgement of said transfer to M. M. Kissong, but as this is now the property of a above grantee, this deed to make known Elba M. North. By this Quit Claim Deed said Corporation, Dickason Goodman Lumber Co. also admits and confesses full and complete satisfaction and payment in full of one certain Mortg. on a above property given by M. M. Kissong to said Corporation filed Nov. 18, 1903 & recorded in Book 1, Page 506 at Sapulpa, Okl. And said Corporation Dickason Goodman Lumber Co. does coniform by these presents the Release of said Mtg. made by said Corporation to M. M. Kissong filed Sept. 1st 1904 and duly recorded in Book 1, Page 13 of Sapulpa Dist. but which said Release by over sight did not have an acknowledgement in proper form.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the appurtenances and privileges thereunto belonging or appertaining, and all the estate, right, title, interest and claim whatever of the said party of the first part either in law or equity to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of the said party of the second part, her heirs and assigns, forever.
