

QUIT CLAIM DEED 7195
WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

THIS INDENTURE, Made this 20th day of September A.D., 1907 between C. C. Breweson
and Glenda Breweson, his wife of Albuquerque, N.M. Indian Territory, District, party
of the first part, and David B. Breweson of Tulsa, Okl. Terr. party of the second part,
witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Two Thousand and Fifty dollars,

in hand paid by the said party of the second part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has remised, released, sold, conveyed and quit claimed, and by these presents does remise, release, sell, convey and quit claim unto the said party of the second part, her heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title, interest, claim and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following described lot, piece or parcel of land or improvements, situated in

the city of Tulsa, Indian Territory, Western District, and known and described as follows, to-wit:

8 alls of Lot One (1) in Block four (4) in
Grandview Addition to the City of Tulsa as is shown
by the recorded plat and survey thereof, said interest
of the party of the first part being that of one of the
four heirs of B. C. and Jane Breweson, deceased
state of Kansas. BE it remised that on the 27th
County of Bernalillo, day of September A.D., 1907 before me the
undersigned a notary public in and for the County
and State aforesaid came Glenda Breweson, who is
personally known to me to be the same person who executed
the foregoing instrument and duly acknowledged the
execution of the same. I do witness whereby the aforesaid

David B. Breweson all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
