

QUIT CLAIM DEED 7331  
COMPARED  
WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

THIS INDENTURE, Made this 10<sup>th</sup> day of October A.D. 1907 between Joe S. Eaton

and his wife of Okmulgee Indian Territory, District party  
of the first part, and Daniel Company of Boysston I.T. party of the second part,

witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar dollars  
in hand paid by the said party of the second part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) has received, released, sold, conveyed and quit claimed, and  
by these presents does by these presents do release, sell, convey and quit claim unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title,  
interest, claim and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following described lot, piece or parcel of land or improvements, situated in

the Indian Territory, Weleetka Judicial District, and known and described as follows, to-wit:

The north half of the south west quarter and south  
east-quarter of the north west quarter of Section Thirty-two  
(32) township Sixteen (16) North Range Twelve (12) miles  
of the Indian Base Meridian in Indian Territory  
containing one hundred and twenty acres more or less,  
as the same may be according to the United States Survey thereof.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the appurtenances and privileges thereunto belonging or appertaining, and all the estate, right,  
title, interest and claim whatever of the said part of the first part either in law or equity to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of the said party of  
the second part, his heirs and assigns, forever.

And I, Florence H. Eaton  
wife of the said Joe S. Eaton

for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Daniel Company

all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
