KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS,

That we John N. McFarland and Lucy McFarland his wife
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Six Hundred fifty 00/100 DOLLARS,

do hereby grant,
bargain, sell and convey unto said Pearl Oil and Investment Company and unto its heirs and assigns forever, the following
lands lying in the Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The south-west quarter of the south-east and the
north-east quarter of the south-east quarter of the
south-west quarter all in section twenty-three
(23) township twenty-two (22) range fourteen (14)
in the Cherokee Nation Indian Territory

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the said The said Pearl Oil and Investment Company and unto its heirs
and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Pearl Oil and Investment Company that she will forever warrant and de-
fend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Lucy McFarland, wife of the said John N. McFarland for and in consideration of the said sum of
money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said The Pearl Oil and Investment Company
as well as all of my rights as wife to said sum of money all right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.
