

# QUIT CLAIM DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

THIS INDENTURE, Made this 15th day of January, A.D., 1908, between J. W. Haver of Oklahoma District, party and (a single man) his wife of Tulsa Indian Territory, District, party of the first part, and D. B. Free of Tulsa, Oklahoma party of the second part, witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred dollars, in hand paid by the said party of the second part (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has remised, released, sold, conveyed and quit claimed, and by these presents does remise, release, sell, convey and quit claim unto the said party of the second part, heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title, interest, claim and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following described lot, piece or parcel of land or improvements, situated in the City of Tulsa Oklahoma Indian Territory, District, and known and described as follows, to-wit:

The east one-half (1/2) of lot No. five (5) and all of lot No. six (6) and seven (7) and all in Block No. one hundred and sixty-eight (168) of the original town of Tulsa, Oklahoma, according to the official plat and survey thereof

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the appurtenances and privileges thereunto belonging or appertaining, and all the estate, right, title, interest and claim whatever of the said part of of the first part either in law or equity to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of the said part of the second part, heirs heirs and assigns, forever.

And I, J. W. Haver wife of the said D. B. Free

for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said D. B. Free

all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
