KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

That we Mrs. J. J. Bledsoe and (as widow)
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Thirty Five Hundred & no/100 DOLLARS,
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant,
 bargain, sell and convey unto said the Right Way Laundry Company and unto its heirs and assigns forever, the following
 lands lying in the Creek Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:
the East sixty feet of Lot no three (3) and town (4) in Block forty two
(42) Original town of Tulsa,

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the said the Right Way Laundry Company and unto its heirs
 and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said the Right Way Laundry Company that she will forever warrant and de-
 fend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Mrs. J. J. Bledsoe, wife of the said the Right Way Laundry Company for and in consideration of the said sum of
 money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said the Right Way Laundry Company all right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.
