WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we John A. Mitchell and Alice M. Mitchell
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred fifty (\$350.00) DOLLARS,
the receipt of which is truly acknowledged,

do hereby grant,
 bargain, sell and convey unto said A. P. Feltner and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following
 lands lying in the Creek Nation, Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Sixty-two (62), Black Mountain (17), West Tulsa,
Indian Territory, an undivided one fourth interest in
lots one (1), two (2), three (3), four (4), five (5), six (6), seven (7)
and eight (8) in Black Mountain (17) in West Tulsa
Creek Nation, Indian Territory.

To have and to hold the same unto the said A. P. Feltner and unto his heirs and as-
 signs forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said A. P. Feltner that they will forever warrant and defend the
 title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Alice Mitchell, wife of the said John A. Mitchell for and in consideration of the said sum of
 money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said A. P. Feltner all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
