WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we William Trapp and Emily E. Trapp  
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Eighteen hundred and no/100 DOLLARS,  
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged.

do hereby grant,  
bargain, sell and convey unto said Betty Weaver and unto her heirs and assigns forever, the following

lands lying in the City of Tulsa Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

the southerly one half (1/2) of lot numbered three (3) Block  
numbered one hundred twenty five (125) in the City of Tulsa,  
Creek Nation, Indian Territory according to the official  
plat thereof

To have and to hold the same unto the said Betty Weaver and unto her heirs and as-  
signs forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Betty Weaver that we will forever warrant and defend the  
title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Emily E. Trapp, wife of the said William Trapp for and in consideration of the said sum of  
money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Betty Weaver all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
