WARRANTY DEED
WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we W. E. Campbell and Emily M. Campbell
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Four hundred (\$400.) DOLLARS,
to them in land paid by James M. Cannon, the receipt whereof
is hereby confessed and acknowledged, do hereby grant,
bargain, sell and convey unto said James M. Cannon and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following

lands lying in the Town of Tulsa Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot numbered ten (10) in Block numbered two (2) in the large
D. Perryman Jr., Addition to the City of Tulsa, I. T. according to the
official plat thereof,

To have and to hold the same unto the said James M. Cannon and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said James M. Cannon that they will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Emily M. Campbell, wife of the said W. E. Campbell for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said James M. Cannon all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
