KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

to said lands paid by R.T. Hellough, the wife whereof is hereby
 duly acknowledged have granted, bargained and sold unto R.T. Hellough,^{do hereby grant,}
 bargain, sell and convey unto said R.T. Hellough and unto his heirs ^{successors and assigns} forever, the following described
 real estate situated in the City of Tulsa, Creek Valley Western District of the Indian Territory, to wit:
all of Section 3, Block 10 in the addition to Tulsa,
Indian Territory, according to the recorded plat thereof
~~and all the privileges, appurtenances and improvements thereto~~
 situated, containing and ~~belonging~~ belonging.

To have and to hold the same unto the said R.T. Hellough and unto his heirs heirs and as
 executors and administrators signs forever, with all appurtenances thereto belonging, and the said Albert Lawrence and Dora M. Lawrence,
 his wife, for themselves their executors and administrators, do
 hereby covenant with said R.T. Hellough, his heirs, executors or administrators, that they will forever warrant and defend the
 title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Dora M. Lawrence, wife of the said Albert Lawrence, for and in consideration of the said sum of
 money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Albert Lawrence, all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
