WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we Elva Harris (nee Owen) heir of Martha Owen and Addie Owen deceased
~~his wife~~, for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred (\$100.00) DOLLARS,
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant,
 bargain, sell and convey unto said The Tulsa Addition Company and unto its successors
 lands lying in the Creek Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The southeast quarter (SW 1/4) of northwest quarter (NW 1/4) and the southeast quarter (SE 1/4)
of northwest quarter (NW 1/4) and east half of northwest quarter (NE 1/4) of southeast quarter (SE 1/4)
and lots three (3) and four (4) all in section two (2) and the west five (5) acres of the said
12.03 acres of lot one (1) in section fourteen (14) all in township nineteen (19) north,
range twelve (12) east except so much as is taken by the M. & T. R. R. Co. as a right of
way, being the allotment of said quarter.

To have and to hold the same unto the said The Tulsa Addition Company and unto its successors
 signs forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said The Tulsa Addition Company that I will forever warrant and defend the
 title of said lands against all claims whatever.
