KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we John A. Clelland and Martha S. Clelland  
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred DOLLARS,  
in hand paid by Daniel P. Rody and Catherine Rody the receipt  
of which is hereby acknowledged do hereby grant,  
bargain and convey unto said Daniel P. Rody & Catherine Rody and unto their heirs and assigns forever, the following  
lands lying in the \_\_\_\_\_ Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

To have and to hold the same unto the said Samuel P. Rody and Catherine Rody and unto their heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant . . . with said Daniel P. Rody and Catherine Rody . . . that we . . . will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Marta L. Clapham, wife of the said John A. Clapham for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Reverend R. Redy and Catherine Redy all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
