WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we Jacob I. Harlow and Alabama Harlow
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred & seventy five DOLLARS,
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged
 do hereby grant,
 bargain, sell and convey unto said P. C. Coyne and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following

lands lying in the Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of lot number one (1) block number twenty three (23) in
the City of Tulsa, Ind. Ter. according to the approved plat
made by W. L. Survey

To have and to hold the same unto the said P. C. Coyne and unto his heirs and as-
 signs forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said P. C. Coyne that we will forever warrant and defend the
 title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Alabama Harlow, wife of the said Jacob I. Harlow for and in consideration of the said sum of
 money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said P. C. Coyne all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
