WARRANTY DEED
WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we Chaparr Rogers and Emma Rogers
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) DOLLARS,
in hand paid by Charles Page

do hereby grant,
bargain, sell and convey unto said Charles Page and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following

lands lying in the Creek Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Beginning at the southwest corner of the southeast
quarter (SE 1/4) of the north west quarter (NW 1/4) of Section
twenty seven (27) township nineteen (19) north Range
thirteen (13) east - running north 880 feet; thence
running east 2640 feet; thence running south 880 feet
thence running west 2640 feet to the place of beginning
containing 32.99 acres more or less to the order of J. H. Haverly
to have and to hold the same unto the said Charles Page and unto his heirs and as-

signs forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Charles Page that we will forever warrant and defend the
title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Emma Rogers, wife of the said Chaparr Rogers for and in consideration of the said sum of
money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Charles Page all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
