WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we J. M. Gillette, single man, Jennie S. Hall his wife, and J. H. Hocker and Carrie G. Hocker
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and no DOLLARS,
Cash in hand paid by J. P. Hamilton, the receipt of which is hereby
acknowledged do hereby grant,
 bargain, sell and convey unto said J. P. Hamilton and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following
 lands lying in the Gillette Hall addition to Pullar, Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of Lot No. Eleven (11) in Block No. Twenty (20) in the Gillette Hall
addition to the town of Pullar. It according to the survey and
plat thereof

To have and to hold the same unto the said J. P. Hamilton and unto his heirs and as-
 signs forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging. Except one oil & gas lease to Grant C. Stephens or his assigns
we contract and bind myself with said J. P. Hamilton that we will forever warrant and defend the
 title of said lands against all claims whatever persons.

And I, Jennie S. Hall and Carrie G. Hocker, wife of the said J. M. Hall and J. H. Hocker for and in consideration of the said sum of
 money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said J. P. Hamilton all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
