WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we S. Anna B. White (widow) and her heirs, for and in consideration of the sum of One thousand DOLLARS,

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto said Samuel Bell and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Lindsay Addition, to the town of Tulsa, Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot four (4) five (5) and (6) in block eight (8) in the Lindsay Addition to the town of Tulsa according to the J. B. Patten survey and plat of April 1904.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Samuel Bell and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Samuel Bell that she will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, S. Anna B. White, wife of the said Samuel Bell for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Samuel Bell all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
